Unplanned Errand a Lifesaver

It isn't every year at Thanksgiving that I can be grateful to simply be alive. On this last trip to India, I had a scare that makes me grateful to still be here. The day was blistering, and the humidity was the worst it had been all week. One of our college girls came to see me. She had received a phone call from her friends. College exam fees needed to be paid by the next day, and we were five hours away from her college. She asked if I could take her there to pay her fees; otherwise, she would be assessed a late fee.

While a day of traveling was not in my schedule, I told her yes, we would leave in the morning. I would have to cancel my other appointments. We enjoyed the day and road down with our driver, Ramana. I met her friends, and we paid her fees. We decided to drive back that same night and arrived home around 11 o'clock.

Wearily, I climbed the steps to my apartment. When I opened the door, I was shocked to see a hole in my wall. The heat and humidity had brought a thunderstorm to our area while we had been away for the day. Apparently, lightning struck a tree outside my living room wall, causing an explosion. Bujji heard the boom of the tree when it was hit, but he hadn't realized any damage had been done to our property. However, a large chunk of concrete the size of a volleyball had blown across my living room into a cabinet. It shattered, and large pieces of rock had flown around the room all the way into my upstairs office. The couch and floor were covered with pieces of debris. If I had been home sitting in my favorite chair or on the couch, I could have been killed. When I called my staff to come and see the mess, they, too, were shocked.

This Thanksgiving I am especially grateful that God saved my life by sending me on an unplanned errand.
