After school, the children relish some free time for play. Some love games or sports while others enjoy arts and crafts. We have teens who win awards at state and national levels for their skills in running, soccer, cricket, and other games. Anyone who can teach baseball or basketball or any other American sport will put smiles on many HOINA boys' faces. Our girls have loved learning to crochet and other handicrafts. Ranging from three to over 20 years old, we have 100 girls and 100 boys. There is always someone looking to spend time with you.

It costs about \$25 dollars a day to stay on campus in the guest house. That price includes three meals per day. While we are just 20 miles from the beach and ocean, about a two-hour drive in the other direction will take you to the mountains and waterfalls of Aracu, where many tribal peoples live.

We love music of many forms. Our children will learn songs that you could teach them, and they will perform lively dances and entertaining dramas for you when you come.

If at any time in the future you are interested to visit, please do not consider April, May, or June for a number of reasons: First, the weather is simply too hot. Those months are our summer in India. Second, our students are required to take final exams in April as school is preparing to let out. Then in May, our children who have families are home visiting them and won't be on campus. June is the kickoff to our school year, so we don't want to disturb them as they are getting back into the swing of studying.

If you're looking for something to bring that is useful, please consider packing some sweatshirts for our children to wear in the cold months. (When you're used to 130° F, 55° in the winter is VERY cold!)


