Sharmila, being shy, insisted on reading her vows directly to Finny without the microphone in a very personal, private moment for the two of them. Observing the expressions on their faces, both Finny and Sharmila were blessed and encouraged by the other's words. The rings were exchanged with tears. Finally, Finny lifted Sharmila's veil, and he was able to see his bride clearly without covering. A happy man was he! Then came the exchange of floral garlands, which are similar to the exchange of rings in a Western wedding ceremony. The presentation of a Bible to bind their marriage together with the Word of God followed. Finally, the ceremony closed with a prayer over the couple from all of the pastors present at the ceremony. We knew each other's stories because of the reports Mom related as she worked to bring her two families together—merely separated by the North Atlantic Ocean, the Arabian Sea, and thousands of miles! 
