


Kindness Begets Kindness

HOINA has changed not only more than 4000 lives in India but also my life in America. I was a young girl at church campouts, when I met Darlene Large (known as "Mom" at HOINA). She was the arts and crafts teacher, and her projects were the highlight of my day. Although she was teaching many kids, this was when I first experienced her gift of making one feel as if you were the only focus of her attention. I know the children of HOINA felt similarly. I am amazed at how much detail she remembers of every child: their names, the long list of circumstances that brought them to the orphanage, and most importantly, how she deciphered each child needs-whether emotional or physical. She then would find their talents and interests and nurture that child.

More than 25 years ago, I saw one of the HOINA newsletters and recognized Darlene's name; it brought back such fun memories of my childhood time with her. Without hesitation I knew she was doing God's work. I contacted Darlene and told her I wanted to sponsor a girl. Finding me a girl to sponsor was no random pick

from a list. Since she knew what my hair looked like: dark and curly, and unfortunately many times frizzy, she paired me with Ishwarya, who had similar hair so we "looked" like mother and daughter. Mom's personal attention to the selection was so touching.

Immediately, I started paper correspondence with my new ward, who was only three years old at the time. Mostly our communication was one way, because Ishwarya was so little. Doting on her I would send small packages, which, of course, included a

brush! And, true to form, Mom would send me a photo of Ishwarya holding my package. As she got older, I was thrilled to get a letter and a photo at Christmas time.

Happily, our relationship grew as we got to know each other. When Ishwarya was about twelve, I was blessed to go to India. Finally, I would meet her in person! As she ran to me and gave me the tightest hug, I experienced such joy to see her. She was so excited to show me her talents from athleticism (doing flips) to her scholastic achievements. We spent a good deal of time just smiling.

I would return to HOINA another seven times (almost annually). Ishwarya taught me dances we would perform together; and I would do arts and crafts projects with the children as Darlene had once taught me. As Ishwarya got older I was so proud of her when she carried out HOINA's tradition of being a big sister to the little and/or new children. Her maternal instincts were strong and growing.

Darlene's objective for HOINA was always to educate each child and make them into productive citizens (far from the situations from which they had arrived). Next, it was time for Ishwarya to attend college. She performed exceptionally well on entrance exams and in her classes and graduated with a degree in computers. She went on to a successful career with Cognizant, where she also was named top employee.

As Ishwarya looked for more in her life, she met and fell in love with Murugan. I was saddened to not attend their wedding in person; however, I woke up at 2 a.m. (my time) and, dressed in my Indian wardrobe, used WhatsApp to tune into the wedding. It turned out that my outfit and the bride's were both pink!

Recently, more than 25 years after I started this journey, I was given the loveliest blessing. Ishwarya's maternal instinct is finally fulfilled: my "daughter" gave birth to my "granddaughter" and named her after me, calling her by my full name, "Rozvinci." I am so honored!

Although, due to Covid-19, I haven't visited HOINA in the past few years, I stay in touch through video calls. In fact, I just wished my "granddaughter" a happy second birthday.

Thank you, Darlene, for bringing such happiness to my world.
