Nesh was struggling to remove his sandals. Before I knew it I saw our boys' home housefather Shadrach leaning down to unstrap the boy's sandals. Once again, he stooped to help put them back on for Nesh. What an act of love! If you know of Indian or most Eastern cultures, touching some-

one's shoes is the lowest one can go, the most humble act you can lower yourself to do. It's also considered beneath one to touch someone's feet, forget the shoes. However, Shadrach was raised by Mom in the 1980's. Of course, he knows exactly how to show tangible love as he experienced it from Mom and the other staff during his childhood. She always taught – Love is an action word!

The other day when the teenage girls were acting up and not doing their chores on time, their housemother Vimala got onto them. Vimala Mummy (as kids address her) is known to be on the stricter side compared to Shadrach Daddy. After their scolding, the girls were sulking. That same evening I was going to the city to buy some chairs for the library, and Vimala came to me to ask if I could bring some ice cream for all the children (teenagers included). Seeing that generosity come from Vimala was surprising to me. I chuckled to myself and thought – Love is forgiving.

When the cooks come on time in spite of having a sick kid at their own home, that's love. When they see Todd Uncle or Glory Akka [sister] leave their U.S. home for months to take care of things at HOINA and guiding the lives of the children in India for so long, that's love. When our children get a letter from their sponsor, that's love; when you spare your time or resources for HOINA, it's love.
