All of India's people, no matter their religion or social status, celebrate Republic Day, to honor when the Indian constitution was adopted and India became a fully autonomous republic with a parliament and a president in 1950. Republic Day is filled with patriotic events such as flag raising, marching, singing the national anthem, and speeches telling the stories of the work of the founders and how India came to exist. Jumping in with both feet, Elsie had the opportunity to quiz the HOINA girls on their Indian Constitution facts to prepare them for their civics exam. Everyone was quite proud when they came home with outstanding marks!

As always, our annual Christmas-in-January party added to the excitement of the day. Everyone enjoyed the festivities: singing, dancing, storytelling, gift giving, and a fine meal of chicken biryani filled the rest of the evening. Teams of boys and teams of girls sang and performed self-choreographed dances. The Indian Bollywood and Tollywood movies are a great source for dance moves. The boys and girls wore the Christmas outfits they received in December while the older girls wore elegant saris.

Each child always receives a wrapped shoe box, filled with small things like chocolates, pencils, notebooks, bangles for the girls and cars for the boys, etc. Each child also has the opportunity to request one larger item. Older children request special clothing, a watch, or a trolley (rolling suitcase) for traveling. The big gift for the younger, and some older, girls this year was the giant teddy bear. Who doesn't want something soft and fluffy to cuddle and sleep with?
